What talent do you wish you had? I wish that I could play the bass like [Marcus Miller](#).

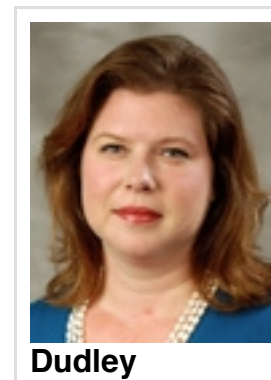
Who has had the greatest influence on you? My father, because he instilled into me my sense of responsibility.
